MINUTES of March 18, 21, 1985 were approved as written on MOTION by Mr. Babcock. Affirmative vote unanimous.

TREASURER'S REPORT for March was accepted upon MOTION by Dr. Scholes. Affirmative vote unanimous.

DISBURSEMENTS included vouchers #1 through #283 and #501 through #610 and #701 \overline{t} hrough #703 totaling \$341,454.27.

A MOTION by Mr. Babcock approved the disbursements and transfer of funds and acknowledged the March payrolls. Affirmative vote unanimous.

BIDS:

Bids for piping and related materials were reviewed and awarded to Norman Supply of Twin Falls at \$18,300. Bids for sheet metal work on the Taylor Building retrofit and also on the kitchen fan modification were awarded to White Plumbing and Heating at \$4,768 for the retrofit and \$3,468 for the kitchen fan modification. The MOTION was by Mr. Babcock. Affirmative vote unanimous.

PLANT FACILITIES: Quotations for insulated PVC pipe from J. D. Haun Company at \$5,400 and from T2R Construction Company for welding labor and materials on the chiller interconnect at \$4,595 were approved to be paid from the Plant Facilities Reserve Fund on MOTION by Mr. Blastock. Affirmative vote unanimous.

Mr. Blastock asked that a discussion of a retreat for the board AGENDA: of trustees be discussed at the next monthly meeting.

PRESIDENT'S REPORT: President Jerry Meyerhoeffer reported the following:

1. Dr. Clifford Trump, who has been the acting president at Idaho State University and who is vice president there, will speak at our graduation May 10.

PRESIDENT'S REPORT CONTINUED:

- 2. CSI's CPT Word Processing Program received a Presidential Commendation a few weeks ago and has now been named Idaho's Adult Education Program of the Year.
- 3. Two of our faculty members attended the Borah Symposium at the University of Idaho recently. The symposium centered around the conflict in South Africa.
- 4. CSI's 20th Anniversary will be celebrated next fall on October 4 and 5. Miriam Breckenridge, president of our foundation, has announced it as an anniversary party and will be working with Joan Edwards and others in planning the celebration.
- 5. Contracts will be mailed out tomorrow. The over-all increase is between 5 and 6 percent.
- 6. Fran Tanner and Gene Hull, with the debate and forensic students, just returned from Stockton, California from the nationals competition. One of our students received a third place trophy. Mrs. Tanner and Mr. Hull do an outstanding job with their students and receive very little recognition.
- 7. At 7 p.m. tomorrow evening the CSI student's art work will be exhibited in the museum.
- 8. Student elections will be held this week. We have some outstanding candidates seeking office.
- 9. Last week, we had some guests on campus from Pakistan to view our fish tech program. They have visited fisheries throughout the United States. This year we have three or four people taking our fish tech program who already have masters degrees.
- 10. A letter from John Rosholt has been received indicating that he has spent some time recently in Boise concerning our geothermal wells and that Jack Kelly from a Boise geological consulting firm will be in the Magic Valley soon to review the geothermal wells and avail us of his expertise.
- 11. We are now beginning construction on the Taylor Administration Building addition. It is scheduled to be completed the first week in September, and then our own crew will complete construction, hopefully, by time of the spring semester.
