WESTERN UNDERGRADUATE EXCHANGE (WUE) AND WAIVER OF NON-RESIDENT TUITION (WNRT)

WESTERN UNDERGRADUATE EXCHANGE (WUE)

The College of Southern Idaho participates in the Western Undergraduate Exchange program (WUE), to financially assist out-of-state students interested in attending CSI. WUE funding allows students from 15 other participating states to enroll at the College of Southern Idaho at a reduced cost. Instead of paying full non-resident tuition plus resident tuition, the tuition rate for WUE students is 150% of the Idaho resident tuition. This results in a tremendous cost savings for eligible students.

Participating **WUE** states in addition to Idaho are Alaska, Arizona, California, Colorado, Hawaii, Montana, Nevada, New Mexico, North Dakota, Oregon, South Dakota, Utah, Washington, Wyoming, and Commonwealth of the Northern Marianas Islands.

WAIVER OF NON-RESIDENT TUITION (WNRT)

CSI also awards a number of out-of-state waivers for students who *are not* residents of the states listed above. The application, eligibility requirements and deadlines are the same as WUE.

HOW DO I KNOW IF I AM ELIGIBLE?

The student must be considered a non-resident for tuition purposes and enrolled as a degree seeking student in an eligible major at the College of Southern Idaho. (Time accrued while participating in the WUE/WNRT program **WILL NOT** count towards the length of time required gaining Idaho residency). To be initially eligible, transfer students must have at least a 2.0 cumulative GPA. Grades are evaluated at the end of each semester and a 2.50 <u>semester</u> GPA required for continuation of the award.

Student may only receive WUE/WNRT funds a maximum of <u>4 traditional semesters</u> (Fall and Spring) and <u>2 Summer</u> semesters, regardless of enrollment status. Students must submit a <u>separate application for the Summer</u> semester to be considered for the Out-of-State tuition waiver for that term and will be awarded as funds allow.

HOW DO I APPLY?

The completed application must be submitted to the CSI Financial Aid Office. Funds are limited and awarded on a first come, first served basis. To be considered for Fall Semester, applications must be submitted by August 15th and by December 15th for Spring Semester. Out-of-state tuition waiver awards will be based on the number of credits the student is enrolled in at 8:00 A.M. on Monday, the second week of classes in a regular semester. If an application is submitted and the student's enrollment plans change, the student must notify the CSI Financial Aid office.
